I purchased two Avet Pro EX30-2's and one Avet Pro EX50-2 and when I went to preset the drags I noticed that the rods were bobbing like a wood pecker. I know that the drags should not do this - it should be smooth and the rod should not bounce. I was not using a heavy setting either - I set them up with 17 lbs of drag at strike. I purchased these reels brand new and just used them for a shark trip - landed about 2-3 blue dogs on each setup. Has anyone else had any problems with the drag not being smooth and causing the rod to "wood pecker"? Will this go away after a couple more trips - or should I have the reels serviced? I am very happy with the product I just want to know how to fix this problem or if it will fix itself once the drag "burns" in a little more. Any information would be great.

In my experience, this is normal for a new Avet. I have owned many Avets and serviced 10x more than I have owned and all of them start out like this.

In my opinion, you need to open them up and do a complete service including adding Cal's Grease to the drags. Then, I would mount your reels on the rod it is designed for, hook the line up to the back of your buddy's truck, put the reel in full, and have your buddy do about 5 or 6 fast 50 yards runs and re-test. If it is still jumpy, do another 5 or 6 runs. Repeat until smooth.

Avet will tell you not to grease their drags. It will void your warranty. They will also tell you that you need to "break in" your reel for it to smooth out and what you are experiencing is normal. For these reasons (and others), I no longer purchase Avets. However, I am happy with my "broken in" Avets and fish them all the time.

My 50W was a little jumpy right out of the box. I hooked it to my bumper and had a friend speed off a hundred yards. Started with light drag and increased to about 25-30 pounds on the third and final run. Smooth as butter by then and has landed tuna with no issue.

No drag grease either on mine and I can get 52 at Strike and 60 at Full.

I don't want to void the warranty on my reels and I know that the drag is designed to be run "dry", so with that being said I will just have to catch some smaller tuna to get them ready for serious battle. Do you guys wash these the same way you would wash other reels - some boat soap and a boat brush and then spray them down but try not to blast the reel with water for too long - then shake the excess water out of them?

I spray mine with fresh water every trip whether I fish it or not. Dry them with a towel... In winter they get a good going over and cleaning... I remove the reel foot and grease under it, all clamp screws, and between the foot and rod to avoid salt from sitting... Avet recommends complete submersion with drags engaged and free spool, cranking under water... My method has never failed me. I've never sunk my reels... I do a full service every year or two depending on use of each reel. Good luck

For me, it's a light coating of Cal's Grease and while the reel is open, degrease or at least add a drop of oil to the two spool bearings so that the spool will spin a little better.

If you want to "break in" your drags, hoping the first few fish take care of that jerky problem, go for it. Or if you really want to so that bumper hitch getaway car thing, I guess that's an option. But, I'm not willing to take the chance on dry drags that appear jerky. That's why mine are fished wet. Works for Accurate, too, as they are greasing their drags with Cal's grease at the factory.


